

Foreword

Periodic elections are regarded as the cornerstone of democracy. Through these elections, people exercise their right to choose representatives who will shape state policies. The foremost duty of these elected officials is to address the needs of the nation and its people by formulating laws, policies, rules, and programs. Moreover, they are responsible to implement constitutional provisions and laws while serving the interests of the public.

In Nepal, the Khas-Arya community has historically dominated the formulation of state policies, leading to a gender disparity where men hold the majority of powerful positions. Consequently, Indigenous People, Madhesi, Dalits, Tharus, Muslims, and other marginalized groups have faced consistent exclusion and marginalization. This led to numerous socio-political movements over a period of time, advocating for proportional representation of all communities in the institutions responsible for policy formulation and implementation. Consequently, the constitution includes a provision for a proportional representation system, aiming to guarantee equal representation of marginalized communities in the governance structures. However, the effective implementation of this principle remains elusive.


In the 2022 elections, 275 Members of Parliament were elected to the House of Representatives, and 550 Assembly Members were elected in seven provinces. These representatives were elected through a mixed electoral system- through a first-past-the-post and proportional representation system. At 753 local level, 293 Mayors/Deputy-Mayors, 460 Rural Municipality Chairpersons/Vice-Chairpersons, and 6,743 Ward Chairpersons were elected. Unfortunately, detailed and disaggregated data on the caste and gender of these elected representatives are not available in the public domain.

The Dignity Initiative has prepared this data booklet entitled "Election Results 2022: Data Analytics on the Status of Gender and Social Inclusion," with a special focus on the representation of gender and social inclusion in the Parliament, Provincial Assembly, and Local Government. This comprehensive data analysis of the election results is considered a valuable resource for political parties, policymakers, individuals, and social organizations actively working in the field of gender and social inclusion.

Figure 1 : Electoral results of past four elections and representation of different caste/ethnicity









Figure 3: Electoral result of the seven provincial assemblies and community-wise representation





Figure 5 : Party-wise representation of different caste and ethnic groups in the seven provincial assemblies









Figure 7 : Representation of different caste/ethnicity in key positions within local government





Figure 8 : Gender-wise representation of different caste/ethnic groups in the position of chairperson and vice-chairperson in rural municipalities





Figure 8 : Elected chairperson and vice-chairperson from different gender, caste, and ethnic groups in rural municipalities





Figure 9 : Gender-wise representation of different caste/ethnic groups in the position of ward chair





Figure 10 : Province wise representation of caste/ethnic groups in the position of mayor and chairperson at the local government





Figure: 12 : Caste/ethnicity wise representation of chairperson in the seven provinces







Figure 14: Representation of different caste/ethnicity in Nepal's major policymaking bodies







Figure 15 : Candidates of different caste/ethnic groups in the HoR FPTP election, 2022





Figure 16: Party wise candidates in the FPTP from different caste/ethnic groups in the HoR election, 2022





Figure 18 : Candidates of different caste/ethnic groups in the provincial assembly from FPTP election, 2022




